

## PAINTING PROJECT FOR ABIGAIL STUART HOUSE



A surprise arrived in the form of notification that The Woman's Club of Olympia did receive a grant in the amount of \$10,000 from the Thurston

#### Woman's Club Evening Meeting Notes January 8, 2025

The meeting was held at the Clubhouse and after some socializing before 7:00 pm, the meeting was called to order. The Collect was read, the Pledge of Allegiance recited and the visitors introduced. Lisa Parshley, newly elected Representative to the 22<sup>nd</sup> District, was the first to speak. She introduced herself as a veterinarian and a person working for change. She has long combined her interest in helping animals and people with the Paws 4 a Cause cancer walk and fundraiser. She ran for Olympia City Council first to get more experience and to start at a level she thought she could make a difference at. Now as a state representative, she is looking to help other people navigate to get what they want and need, to center on People. She is trying to put finances in every conversation she has...to get people to apply for grants, resources, planting seeds to help themselves and others. There are often resources there, people need to know how to access them and sometimes be pushed to apply for them.

Rachel Grant is newly elected Thurston County Commissioner. She ran as Rachel Dreon and has just married. She comes from a background of experiencing first hand many difficult parts to life and the law. Grant described herself as a proud 2004 graduate of Thurston County Drug Court. She now has a master's degree in public administration from The Evergreen State College and wants to improve behavioral health equity in our county. She feels because of her lived experience she has important insight into ways to do so and involve others. There are also city and county commissions which lack residents who could help out on them and gain experience themselves.

We had a good discussion about upcoming legislative issues like medical mergers and the need for comprehensive human services. Human trafficking was included in the discussion as we talked about shelter beds and services. It is probable we will need more as the World Soccer Cup is held here in 2026 since trafficking ramps up with any sports gathering and we already have few enough compared to the need.

Upcoming events like the Authors BookTalk on March 19th and the Wine and Chocolate Bingo on February 7th were announced. For the February evening meeting we hope to center on poetry. Susan will invite Cynthia Pratt, Poet Laureate of Lacey, to be our speaker and everyone is encouraged to bring a piece of poetry to share for Valentine's Day!Meeting adjourned at 8:00 pm.
