



#### **UPDATES ON HOUSE RESERVATIONS**



As you may be aware, our current company who handles our reservations, checks email and phone messages, prepares contracts for renters, and keeps our janitor on task for cleaning schedules, will no longer be assisting us after December 31<sup>st</sup>. We have reached out to other companies who could take over, be trained by the current company, and hit the ground running in January. The cost of hiring a new company is in the multiple thousands of dollars. To that end, the House Committee is looking into taking on some of the tasks as a Club. We are working out details now and hopefully doing some of the tasks "in house" will save us in the long run.

BUT, to do this we need everyone's help. We want to keep our house and in order to keep the doors open, we need a minimum of \$3,000 each month in rental income. More details are forthcoming.



ALSO, the House Committee is looking for volunteer tour guides. If you can spare a block of time once or twice a month to show the house to prospective renters, please contact Barbara Pugliese. You will receive training as to what to say and we can put you on a volunteer calendar for whatever time you can give us. Once you are on the calendar, we will rely on you to be available if there is a tour. If there are no tours, you will not be required to be at the house. We require renters to visit the house before signing a contract so they can see what is available. Even if you only sign up for a time slot once or twice a month, we can schedule tours with your help. Training for the tour

guides will be easy. If you cannot do the stairs, it would be best to have your volunteer time for something else, because guides will need to access the upstairs. Please think about volunteering for us.


#### REPORTING HOURS

**General business**- Speaker Sargent Josh Marinson spoke regarding personal safety. Key points

- \* Not answering the door to strangers. You do not have to open the door for anyone. Having peep holes for door.
- Staying alert to your surroundings.
- \* Recent increase in I-5 collisions resulting in carjackings. Mostly in King and Pierce counties. I this happens to you immediately call 911, do not get out of your car.
- \* If needed the non emergent number for Olympia police is 360-704-2740 \*Have a plan. Know what you would do in case of attack ie. attack back, run away or make a lot of noise.
- \* Homeless being a bigger issue in our area. It is ok to call the non emergent number and ask to have a person removed from property. Try not to engage in the situation yourself.
- \* Ok to let the police know if there is an event in the building in the evening especially in the darker months so they can be aware.
- \* Red flags for scammers on the phone. Do not give personal information or money over the phone. If there is a person calling identifying themselves as family member in trouble. Try calling that person directly to check the story. Do not let a scammer create a sense of urgency.
- \* He suggests a pepper blaster instead of pepper spray. Made by Kimbler can get on Amazon.
